### Sishumon:

This project is a stepping stone for the first generation learners. Sishumon project aims to impart awareness on basic education to the pre-school children (age group 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  years to 5 years). Students are exposed to education by story telling rhymes with action etc. They are encouraged to identify vegetables, fruits, flowers, birds & animals, shapes through colourful materials and attractive visual Media. In this project we also try to develop some basic civil values. The program provides for a daily small snack at the end of the classes. We have forty (40) students in our Sishumon project. At the end of every check up we convene a mothers' council meeting to inform them the problems that have been identified in the health check-up and try and emphasize the importance of health & hygiene in daily lives

# BTF Kalyani:

BTF Kalyani started on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2008 with eight students. Now the project has twenty students with an average attendance of 15. The objective of this project is to introduce basic literacy and enhance basic education among the children, who are not going schools regularly or have dropped out of school completely. Our target is help and encourages them to go back to mainstream education in formal schools. The project space has been provided by one of our dedicated members. We use the curricular books which have been introduced by the State Government in its *Sarbo Siksha Abijan Program*.

# BTF Wipro Cares Learning Center:

This project started on 12<sup>th</sup> January 2009 with thirty students at Kalikapur Village, Rajarhat, North 24 Parganas. Initially the project was set up for the children of migrant labours, brick field workers and the families who are in economically distressed. Later on we have realized that to bring the children of brick field workers is difficult as they are not allowed to go outside their brick-kiln. They are also the seasonal dwellers of that area. It affects their regularity in attendance. The scenario is same for the migrant labours. Poor villagers are requesting us to take their children because the existing school facilities in that locale cannot fulfill their expectations which are required for their children's education. Now we have fifty seven students who come regularly. Children are provided free education, educational materials (text books, exercise books, drawing books, crayons etc), free medical facilities and supplementary food which are affordable and cost effective. We run this project in collaboration of *WIPRO Cares Trust*.

## Matrimon:

MATRIMON project wants to strive earnestly to alleviate the level of consciousness of the parents, especially the mothers of the children of our schools so that they become gradually able to grasp the importance of the basic education for the future of their children. This will make them able to comprehend the necessity of maintaining cleanliness and hygienic atmosphere for the development of their children as well as their own.

# Susiksha (Spoken English class for the young adults):

This is to impart practical knowledge in English and Basic Computer literacy among the youth who are in process of taking education of Secondary and Higher Secondary level. Students from the families of Lower economic classes are generally found to be very weak in these areas with microscopic exceptions. Towards Future intends to address these problems through coaching classes in

rural and urban slum areas. We have already established two coaching centers – One at Kashinathpur - Manicktala and the other one is at Bangur.

Literacy program for the children of Brick-field workers:

We started a day care learning center for the children of brick field workers at Kashinathpur. Thirty students registered their name. The medium of teaching is Hindi. We help them to identify colours and numerals (both in Hindi & English). We also teach them about health & hygiene. We provide them free Tiffin; educational materials like paper, pencil, board, chalk, drawing book, colour pencil etc. We organized one health check up for them. Most of them have been identified as malnourished and suggested for de-worming. Doctor also suggested them to be clean always for their good health. These families have migrated mostly from Bihar, Orissa and Jharkhand and also Murshidabad district of West Bengal etc.
