



করোনা সংক্রমণ ঠেকাতে মার্চের ২৩ থেকে দেশ জডে লকডাউন চলছে। অন্য সব কারখানার মতো বন্ধ ইটভাটাগুলিও। অথচ ওই সব ইটভাটায় রয়ে গিয়েছেন ভিন রাজ্যের একাধিক পরিযায়ী শ্রমিক ও তাঁদের পরিবার। ভাটা চালু থাকলে মাটি মাখা থেকে শুরু করে পাকা ইট তৈরি পর্যন্ত কাজ করার পরে সপ্তাহ শেষে শ্রমিকেরা রেশনের টাকাটুকু পান। ওই ব্যবস্থাকে 'ফরোন' বলে। কিন্তু এখন চল্লি বন্ধ। কাজ বন্ধ। ২চলে

বর্তমানে রেশনের টাকাও আর পাচ্ছেন না কেউ।

এই অবস্থায় রাজারহাট-ভাঙড় এলাকার একটি স্বেচ্ছাসেবী সংস্থা যেমন নিজে থেকে এগিয়ে এসেছে তেমনই আবার কোনও কোনও থানা নিজের এলাকার ইটভাটার শ্রমিকদের জন্য একটি আন্তর্জাতিক স্বেচ্ছাসেবী সংস্থার কাছে সাহায্য চেয়েছে।

রাজারহাট-ভাঙড় (২) নম্বর এলাকায় কাজ করা ওই স্বেচ্ছাসেবী সংস্থার তরফে সুপ্রিয়া রায়চৌধুরী জানিয়েছেন, তিনি খোঁজ নিয়ে দেখেছেন মোট পাঁচটি ইটভাটায় দুশোর মতো মানুষ আটকে রয়েছেন। যাঁরা কাজ বন্ধের জন্য রেশনের টাকা পাচ্ছেন না। এমনকি অনেকে পরিবার নিয়েই লকডাউনের সময়ে হেঁটে বাডি ফেরার কথা ভাবছিলেন। সুপ্রিয়ার কথায়, "আমরা সঙ্গে সঙ্গে তাঁদের আটকাই। কারণ স্ত্রী-সন্তান নিয়ে এখান থেকে হেঁটে ঝাডখণ্ড, বিহারে ফিরতে গিয়ে তাঁরা রাস্তায় না খেতে পেয়ে মারা যেতেন।" তিনি আরও জানান, এর পরেই সোশ্যাল মিডিয়ায় তাঁদের সাহায্যের জন্য আবেদন করা হয়। প্রথম ধাপে যে ভাবে সাড়া মিলেছে তা থেকে ১৮০টি পরিবারকে গত দু'সপ্তাহ চাল, ডাল, আলু, তেল এবং হাত ধোয়ার সাবান দেওয়া হয়েছে।
