### Sishumon:



This is a project set up for the pre-school children. It has been running for the last four years with a student-strength of 50 and the average attendance of 43 to 45. The focus of the project is to make a habit among the children of attending school regularly from an early age so that they continue it in future when they will be in formal school. In this learning centre we interact with the children by playing various games with them and through this process we try to develop their social & behavioural skills, physical and motor development and speaking abilities. At the end of the class the children are provided with tiffin which is

both economic and nutritious. In every quarter we hold a, meeting with the mothers where we discuss with them our methods of teaching and the food value of the food provided in our center. We encourage mothers to provide the same type of food at home. Individual files are maintained for all the children to keep record of their development. Several Health camps are organized to monitor their health. Last year twenty six children mainstreamed in class I in the local primary school.

### BTF Kalyani:



BTF Kalyani is a project for the children who are in formal school but are incapable to cope up with their lessons in class. The center starts at 2.30 pm and continues till 5 pm. Focus is to provide primary standard education. Along with basic education we also organise Yoga training and cultural activities like drawing, music and dance. To build up their confidence we encourage the children and give them the opportunity to take part in different cultural programmes organized in the local community. They have been praised in different programmes. At present, thirty children have enrolled their names in this center with an average attendance of twenty to twenty five. We have two teachers and one volunteer who contribute their time and effort to run this project successfully. We also provide medical support and Tiffin to our students.

## BTF Wipro Cares Learning Center:



This is a non-formal learning center set up for the children of 6 years to 14 years. Most of students are enrolled at local Primary schools but do not attend school regularly. Some of the students do part time jobs to support their families economically. The center has about sixty students with an average attendance of 45 to fifty. Basic focus is on education. But along with education we also provide training in cultural activities like drawing, art, music,

dance etc. Wipro Cares Trust is supporting this project since its inception. Last year about fourteen students have been mainstreamed in formal school. Due to the observed feature of slow pace learning of many students, we decided to go for an IQ test for all the children to identify the children who are at risk of learning. We also planned to keep their case history in their individual files. We also try to expose them in different programmes like art workshop, day-outing, annual sports and picnic. To enhance the reading habits of the student we have recently provided them with story books from our library.

**Susiksha** (Spoken English class for the youths):



This project is set up to uplift the standard of practical knowledge in English among the young adults who have deficiency of knowledge in this area. Their in-confidence in this language is one of the important hurdles to their careers. By this project, we try to improve their level of confidence in English. We encourage them to read story books, watch English movies which help them to enhance their reading and listening skills. Regular visit of volunteers from corporate and other sectors as facilitators helps them to learn the art of interaction in English. More than thirty five students enrolled their names in our class and average attendance is twenty five to thirty.

**Uttaran** (Elementary educational program for the children of Brick-field workers):





Uttaran is a day care learning center for the children of brick field workers at Kashinathpur. There are two brick fields named BBS and UBW in this area. More than hundred students are our beneficiaries. Most of the children come from Bihar and Jharkhand with their families for seven to eight months. They start coming from October end to November and leave in May & June. Few families migrated from Bengal —Bangladesh border like Bashirhat, Sundarban etc. We noticed that most of the children are keen to learn but their economic status has forced them to work at the age of 10 and 12 years. Almost all children are suffering from malnutrition. The basic hurdle of this project is discontinuation of education as the families do not migrate to the same place every year.

Along with elementary education the project provides food and health care services. **Loreto Day School** is one of our major partners for this project.

### **Smile** (Individual sponsorship program):



Smile is an individual sponsorship project which supports a child to carry on his education. This project can make a change to a young life for the better. To ensure a better future for the less fortunate children of India, we support child education. Through this programme we support poor children to continue their education till they reach 18 years of age(or class XII level Public Examination). If a particular student shows good academic aptitude and does well in the school final examination, s/he will be considered for special support to continue higher studies. If the child is not inclined towards further academic education, "Towards Future" will continue to arrange for opportunity-based vocational training. Monitoring the day to day progress of education of the sponsored children is the soul responsibility of "Towards Future" and the organization is accountable for regular intimation of the same to respective sponsors.
